## Yefim Bronfman

Acclaimed for his Prokofiev interpretations, Yefim Bronfman concludes his complete cycle of the composer's piano sonatas, showcasing the complex harmonies and simple lyricism of Sonata No. 9 and the neoclassical style of Sonata No. 5. Bronfman is joined by violinist Guy Braunstein for the composer's two violin sonatas. One of Prokofiev's finest works, the Violin Sonata No. 1 is noteworthy for its first movement's muted scales, likened by Prokofiev to "wind in a graveyard." Legendary violinist David Oistrakh convinced Prokofiev to transcribe his popular Flute Sonata for violin, and the resulting Violin Sonata No. 2 is one of his most popular works.
