The Ten Days of Awe is the holiest period in the Jewish calendar.

From the eve of Rosh Hashana, the Jewish New Year to Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, long days of prayer, study and fasting are held in synagogues around the country.

And as rabbis and cantors lead the congregation, voices soar in prayer.

At Emanuel Synagogue in Sydney, the choral director is former opera star Andrea Catzel.

She tells Rachael about the different prayers that are sung, including *Avinu Malkeinu*, *Kol Nidre* and even a version of The Mamas & The Papas song *Creeque Alley*.
